

MAINTENANCE OF WOOD FINISHES

General:

All of our wood coating can be maintained in a good clean condition simply by wiping at regular intervals with a soft chamois leather moistened with tepid water. If the coating becomes fairly grubby, a small amount of mild detergent added to the water will ease this cleaning operation. After cleaning, any excess water should be wiped off with a soft dry cloth to leave the coating surface completely dry.

In the event of light scratching, a combination of 00 gauge wire wool and wax should suffice. If deep scratches/bruises occur, it may be necessary to contact our Technical Services Department.

In the case of plastic laminate facing, only non-abrasive detergents or creams should be used.

Liquid Spray:

It is inadvisable to use wax polishes as these can very quickly cause a build-up of wax on the lacquer surface. This will become embedded with dust and dirt and result in a grubby appearance to the lacquer surface. These waxes can also alter the degree of sheen of the lacquer surface – matt finishes will become glossy. In some cases these waxes, can with time, destroy the integrity of the lacquer film.
